More than a textbook

This online-textbook on mental health in childhood and adolescence is free of charge and gives an excellent overview of essential mental disorders in childhood and adolescence and associated topics. Currently, the textbook comprises 10 sections, including a total of 56 clinical topics: A comprehensive introduction is followed by chapters on perinatal and early childhood risk and protective factors as well as developmental disorders. Externalising disorders, mood disorders, anxiety disorders and substance use disorders are each presented in a separate chapter. Furthermore, there are chapters on other disorders, psychiatry and pediatrics and miscellaneous topics such as legal and administrative.

But why is this textbook outstanding? International experts have written the chapters of their field of expertise. They can be downloaded as PDF free of charge. All texts are written in English, and numerous are available in other languages such as Russian, French, Spanish or Portuguese. Chapters of the textbooks include links to video clips and other materials, and power point presentations are available to be applied in the scope of teaching. At the end of several chapters, comprehension questions test the learning progress. Meanwhile the textbook is an indispensable brick of the MH-education of medical and nursing students in many countries.

World congress in Prague

This year the 23rd world congress of the International Society of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Allied Professions (IACAPAP) takes place in Prague (Czech Republic) between the 23rd and the 27th of July. The congress is organized by Czech Psychiatric Association. So far, an outstanding interest in the conference can be recorded: The organizers have received almost 1.000 submissions (more than 1.300 abstracts), including 60 submissions for research symposia, 74 workshops, 33 academic perspectives, 800 free papers and more than 450 posters. Furthermore, the applicants are highly international coming from 80 countries with the majority from India, USA, and Turkey. The speaker panel consists of 29 top experts in the field of child and adolescent mental health. The key-note talk for the opening ceremony will be held by James Hudziak from Vermont, USA. Next IACAPAP MOOC: Safe the date

One of the main aims of the International Society of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Allied Professions is to improve health care for children and adolescents with mental disorders worldwide. In many countries of low to medium income, a well-grounded

training for skilled personnel is not yet established. IACAPAP has started a multilevel training initiative:

The online textbook is free of charge and contains basic knowledge on different topics with respect to child and adolescent Psychiatry. At the end of several chapters, comprehension questions test the learning progress.

The next level is a massive open online course (MOOC) that takes place twice a year. The next IACAPAP MOOC will start the **7th of May 2018**. This internet-based training each extends over five weeks with a weekly work load of about six hours. Multiple short video clips introduce basic topics with respect to child and adolescent psychiatry and psychotherapy, and consolidating questions and short exams are dealt with by participants. In internet-based work groups, students and mentors interchange with each other, and a certificate of attendance can be gained.
